protistology, and zoology.

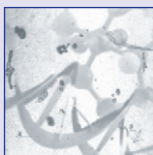


Thus, the society represents

several special working groups exist.

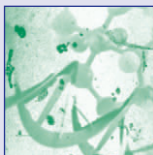
Annual meetings of the society and workshops

to GfBS members.

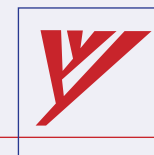


If you wish that
